A Year in Review—RSVP Volunteer Accomplishments

RSVP volunteers get a lot done! Here is a brief review of 2023:

Advisory Council members attended meetings quarterly throughout the year.

BASE Senior Fitness exercise leaders served in 16 locations, with 316 people participating in BASE.

Volunteers helped with Books on the Go at the Fort Dodge Public Library, serving 33 hours.

Volunteers labeled thousands of brochures for Community and Family Resources.

Meals on Wheels deliverers spent 523 hours bringing hot meals to shut-in recipients.

Volunteers spent almost 100 hours helping at the Lotus Treasures thrift store in Webster City.

Food pantry helpers at All Cultures Equal and The Lord's Cupboard put in 515 hours of service.

Hospital greeters and guides at VanDiest Medical Center put in 583 hours of volunteer service.

A volunteer helped at Hamilton County Public Health Foot Clinic, logging 117 hours.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance appointment schedulers logged 450 hours manning the telephone.

Elderbridge senior assistance volunteers served 264 hours in transportation and friendly phone visits.

A volunteer who has helped at the Williams Public Library for many years served 55 hours this year.

A volunteer who does electronics revamping at Heartland Hope and Homes served 357 hours this year.

Pen pals wrote to hundreds of students at 6 schools this past year.

Volunteers sent letters to nursing home residents at eight area nursing homes.

Volunteers helped at the Blanden Art Museum, serving 264 hours.

A volunteer did clerical work to help Upper Des Moines Opportunity and logged 53 hours.

A volunteer who serves with the Webster County Emergency Management office served 32 hours.

Volunteers served as reading buddies at 2 elementary schools in Hamilton County.

SPAN the Generations and Fraud Fighters presenters did a number of presentations this past year.

Volunteers helped to prepare the RSVP newsletter for mailing every quarter.

WEBSTER COUNTY:

BASE Senior Fitness

Exercise leaders are needed to co-lead senior fitness classes. Training is provided by RSVP

Dayton Public Library/Harcourt Public Library

Volunteers are sought for a variety of activities including reading, book shelving/organizing/cleaning, alphabetizing books/making room for new books to be shelved, craft program helpers, summer library program helpers, afterschool helpers (Wednesdays), organizing Busy Bee Bags -Leading a program of a skill they possess (gardening, quilting, sewing, crafting, cooking, etc.)

Read to residents, play card games, help with activities

Village General Store—Opportunity Village

Sort incoming donations, stock shelves, run cash register

Community and Family Resources

Volunteers are needed to label brochures. Work can be done at home

Crestview Nursing and Rehabilitation

Elderly activities—Bingo, one-on-one visits, sing-along leaders, pet visits, etc.

Food Bank of Iowa

Help with food distribution at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, W.C. Food distribution takes place every other month

Head Start

Work with 3-5 year-olds—play time, small group activity time, rest/reading time. M-F 9:00-1:15, you choose how much time you wish to spend

Lotus Community Project

Helpers are needed in the Lotus Treasures thrift shop in Webster City to sort donations

Newsletter Preparation

RSVP puts out a newsletter to approximately 400 addresses each quarter. Helpers are needed to fold, seal, and label newsletters

Elderly activities—Bingo, crafts and cards, one-on-one visits. Flexible times

VanDiest Medical Center

Greeters and Guides are needed as well as Bedside Visitors

Veterans Affairs, Hamilton County

Reading Buddies, tutors, mentors welcome

In the News...



We have newly trained volunteers in our Fraud Fighter program and our SPAN the Generations program who are ready to give presentations to groups.

Fraud Fighters is a program that is facilitated by the lowal nsurance Division, and their goal is to inform people of the scams and fraud schemes that are in our area. Scams are on the rise, especially around the holidays.

SPAN the Generations (SPAN stands for Seniors Preventing Addiction to Narcotics) focuses on the opioid crisis that is growing in our country. The program covers what opioids are, why they are so addictive, questions to ask your doctor if you are prescribed an opioid, how to safely take a prescription opioid, how to safely store it while taking it, and how to properly dispose of any remaining pills. It also gives warning signs to be aware of in a loved one who may be suffering from opioid addiction.
