This year, our program will serve 6 area schools, Webster City Middle School, Southeast Valley Middle School, South Hamilton Elementary, St Edmond Elementary, Stratford Elementary, and St. Thomas Aquinas School.

The Pen Pal program has been very successful because of the great value for the students. They learn the art of letter writing, and of communicating with someone of an older generation whom they have never met. It is a favorite of RSVP volunteers because it is so enjoyable to get a hand-written letter in the mail from a young person, and to get to know the personality of that youngster through their letters.

The Inside Story—Lotus Community Project

Lotus Community Project, established in 2019, is a homeless shelter in Webster County that provides shelter for single women, women with children, and families. The project serves a 6 county area, Webster, Calhoun, Humboldt, Wright, Hamilton, and Pochahontas counties.

RSVP volunteers serve in the thrift store called Lotus Treasures, located at 707 2nd Street in Webster City. Lotus Treasures receives donations of clothing, furniture and all kinds of other home goods, and all proceeds from the store support the women's shelter.

The Lotus Community Project believes that every woman, child and family should have access to adequate housing, support and resources.
