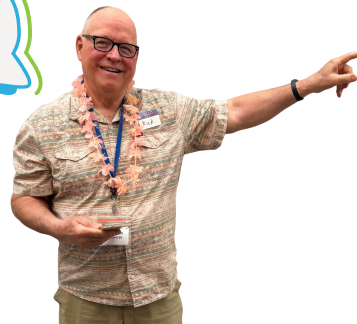

## Senior Expo Recap

The Senior Expo was a great event, yet again. Hosted by Seniors in Story, the Senior Expo reaches many people in the community providing information and resources. RSVP plays a vital role in recruiting volunteers to run the event. This is no small feat, and our Volunteer Coordinator, Kim Anderson, does a great job each year with this! Here are some highlights from the expo in numbers:



- 488 guests attended the Senior Expo
- 69 vendors had booths (including RSVP)
- 79 volunteers served 393 hours

RSVP volunteers stepped up in a big way! **57 of the 79 volunteers are connected with RSVP and served 250 hours!** Thank you to all who were involved!
