Feature Story A Year Like No Other!

Despite a global pandemic and an unprecedented natural disaster, RSVP volunteers continued to serve our communities and make a positive difference in the lives of others. RSVP focused efforts on safe ways for volunteers to contribute during the COVID-19 response throughout our service area. Numerous volunteer assignments were suspended or modified for safe engagement as new needs emerged.

In August 2020, RSVP volunteers again rose to the occasion by staffing multiple Volunteer Reception Centers across Story County, mobilizing community volunteers providing debris clean-up services after the Derecho swept through central Iowa.

In December 2020, RSVP volunteers began assisting with the efforts of Story County Public Health (MGMC) to get residents vaccinated for COVID-19. Over a period of 7 months, 43 RSVP volunteers provided 2,086 hours of service staffing on-site and off-site vaccination clinics.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES

Emergency Services

Contracting with Story County Emergency Management, RSVP coordinates the management of volunteers mobilized in natural disasters, public health and/or public safety emergencies.

Transportation Services

RSVP supplements existing transportation services by providing the recruitment, management, and scheduling of volunteers providing rides to Story County residents. The primary (but not exclusive) purpose of the program is to provide Story County's older adults with safe and reliable transportation to and from medical appointments and other essential services.

RSVP Signature Programs are those assignments that are either coordinated exclusively by RSVP or ones that RSVP plays a significant role in direct partnership with another organization or organizations.

EDUCATIONAL SERVICES—Helping youth succeed academically

Due to COVID-19, many school-based assignments were suspended in 2020-2021 including mentoring and tutoring opportunities, SPEAK UP! public speaking project, and more. Volunteers did continue to serve as Pen Pals through the RSVP Writing Partners Project but fewer schools were able to participate because of hybrid classroom challenges. RSVP Pen Pal volunteers were redirected to write and send cards and letters of encouragement to isolated residents of 9 different care facilities, including the lowa Veteran's Home. 216 RSVP volunteers (1,976 hours) were matched one-on-one with 272 elementary or middle school students as Pen Pals. 9 RSVP volunteers (213 hours) served as

gardeners...planting, caring for and harvesting produce. In 2020-2021 (because of COVID-19) the teaching garden was transitioned to a community garden, gleaning produce to be provided to shelters and food pantries. Partner: Iowa State

RSVP volunteer drivers (734 hours) served 55 **Story County** residents with safe and reliable transportation to and from essential services, with priority given to older adults needing rides to medical appointments. Volunteers used their own vehicles to provide 408 round trips and drove 9,201 miles. (Although suspended in March 2020 due to COVID-19 concerns, this service was restored June 1, 2020 and continued throughout fiscal year

15 RSVP volunteers in Hamilton and Webster Counties (121 hours) resumed facilitating this fitness program at 12 locations for 159

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EMERGENCY SERVICES, PUBLIC HEALTH & SAFETY—Keeping our communities safe and prepared Disaster Services and Public Safety*

Volunteer Management for Emergencies serving Story County: In a natural disaster or other emergency, RSVP volunteers staff a

volunteer reception center and a non-emergency phone bank conducting community volunteer intake and providing information and

referral services for non-emergency calls related to the disaster. **Activations:** After the Derecho windstorms swept through central lowa in August 2020, Central Iowa RSVP volunteers were activated to facilitate a total of **6** Volunteer Reception Centers (VRC's) throughout the county (See pictures below). **6** RSVP volunteers spent **43** hours mobilizing **65** community volunteers who provided **342** hours of debris clean-up services. <u>Partners</u>: Story County Emergency Management (EMA), City of Ames, and other Story County communities.

COVID-19 Response



In addition to providing over 2,000 hours facilitating Public Health COVID-19 vaccination clinics in Story County, RSVP volunteers in all of our service area helped to address needs that emerged from the pandemic including: Making masks for area hospitals, non-profits and schools, writing letters of

encouragement to residents of area nursing homes/care facilities, delivering food boxes/groceries. **Partners:** Mary Greeley Medical Center, Reiman Gardens, Bethany Life Communities, Iowa Veterans Home, Marion Home, Hamilton County Public

Capacity Building – Providing diverse volunteer recruitment and placement support that supplements or enhances or existing services of 55 public, non-profit and health care agencies (not reflected in the other sections of this report)

SPECIAL POPULATIONS (Meet the needs of Veterans, homeless and low-income individuals, those with disabilities)

FOOD SECURITY (Provide food for those in need—home delivered meals, food pantries, community meals, "grab & go" lunches)
